The Bourbon County Commission met in open session with all commissioners and the county clerk present.

Laurie Sisk, reporter with the *Fort Scott Tribune*, was present. Laura Hyer, reporter with the *Bourbon County Review*, was present.

Marty Pearson gave a road report, discussed gravel and roads. Heartland hasn't paid yet.

Doug Miller spoke with commissioners about a junk piece of equipment at the landfill. Commissioners said he could junk it, but Robert Query wants to buy it from the County. Looking into disposal of property laws.

Approval to purchase and install a t.v. screen and computer in the commission room. Commissioners approved the project not to exceed \$3,500.00.

Kendell Mason was present. Discussed Joanne helping with the upcoming election. Asked what's been done to date for the election. Asked about a letter from the Governor. Getting token and other signatory things.

Valorie Leblanc met with commissioners. Transcript of proceedings from bond counsel.

Jingles Endicott made a motion to go into executive session for attorney client matters. Allen Warren second. 10 minutes. 9:55-10:05 am.

Allen Warren made a motion to go into executive session, to discuss non-elected personnel matters, for 30 minutes. Harold Coleman second and all in favor. 10:38 am-11:08 am no action.

Terri Johnson stopped by to discuss fence viewings.

Concerning the Tom Graham fence viewing, Harold Coleman made a motion that the existing fence does need to be replaced and/or repaired, as it is insufficient, as viewed, and the Commission orders and assigns that the two property owners should share the expense equally. Allen Warren seconded the motion and all voted in favor. Commissioners signed the fence viewing to that effect and it was filed

with Register of Deeds and will be mailed to the owners, in accordance with the law.

Concerning the Marti Tuchscher fence viewing, Jingles Endicott made a motion that the existing fence does need to be replaced and/or repaired, as it is insufficient, as viewed, and the Commission orders and assigns that the two property owners should share the expense equally. Allen Warren seconded the motion and all voted in favor. Commissioners signed the fence viewing to that effect and it was filed with the Register of Deeds and will be mailed to the owners, in accordance with the law.

Concerning the David Stewart fence viewing, Allen Warren made a motion that the existing fence does need to be replaced and/or repaired, as it is insufficient as viewed, and the Commission orders and assigns that the two property owners should share the expense equally. Jingles Endicott seconded the motion and all voted in favor. Commissioners signed the fence viewing to that effect and it was filed with the Register of Deeds and will be mailed to the owners, in accordance with the law.

Commissioners reviewed with the County Attorney statutes governing the disposal of county property. If the county wishes to sell property, it can only be sold with the unanimous vote of the board of County Commissioners. If the dollar value is over \$50, but less than \$1,000.00, the sale needs to be listed on annual publication form 19-227.

Allen Warren made a motion to sell, at scrap iron price, 1976 Kenworth dump truck, serial number 1527985, and a 1976 Brut Lowboy trailer, serial number TM1TR1181176, each for less than \$1,000 to Robert Query. Jingles Endicott second and all voted in favor.

Susan Quick. Asked about 19-227. She will check with other treasurers.

Susan Quick asked commissioners to sign bank documents to update signatories. Also received a copy of their driver's licenses and their social security numbers.

A request for Cereal Malt Beverage licenses for the former north and south Hill's Stations, was requested by A&A Kansas, Inc., for consumption off premises. Townships were notified, according to law,

and have submitted their support of approval by commissioners for issuance of the licenses. Harold Coleman motion and Jingles Endicott seconded to approve and all voted in favor.

Commissioners talked about the end of month reports. Working to end September. Commissioners and department heads need reports as soon as possible after the end of the month.
